4th Session

The 4th meeting of the Society of the Holy Family was held at Calvert Hall on the night of the 31st of Dec 1843, at 7 O'cl. p.m. — After invocation of the H. G. & singing the Come Holy Ghost & an instruction was given — afterwards an election took place, when W^m Washington Ford was duly elected 1st Vice President — after singing the Christmas Hymn, With hearts & night prayers were said a few minutes after 9 O'cl & the meeting broke up — Those who chose to remain sang or heard two more hymns before leaving.

5th Session

The 5th meeting of the H. Family was held at Cliff. on 7th Jan. 1844. After prayers & an election took place in which W^m London was chosen 2nd Counsellor, &c as above.

6th Session.
 The 6th meeting of the Holy Family
 was held at Cabot Hall on 11th Jan. 1844
 After proceedings of the S. S. & giving a
 number in the 2 sentences of Bine
 & Minute - We had an election, every person
 voting having the vote or paper folded
 We had by the S. S. 10. paid - which Mr
 Nelson & Hoagist was chosen 2nd Vice
 President & Charles C. Cherry 3rd
 Consideration of the Society - After
 reading down the names of new members
 singing a hymn & night prayer, the
 meeting was concluded - but some hymns
 were sung afterwards & new members de
 lie? which takes till 10 o'clock.

7th Session
 The 7th meeting of the S. S. was held in Cabot H.
 on the 21st Jan. 1844 After prayer singing &
 introduction - The names of the members were
 read & several new members admitted - Some
 remarks on singing - an invitation given by
 the 1st Committee to meet at 10 hours next Thursday
 evening at 7 o'clock for the purpose of practicing
 the singing of hymns &c. - ^{at 10 o'clock} ^{at 10 o'clock}
 8th Session
 The 8th meeting of the S. S. was held in Cabot H.
 on the 28th Jan. 1844 - After singing prayer
 & introduction - an election was held when
 George Stolly was elected by all except
 two votes, as given in precedent - and
 Henry Stovain as 4th Counsellor by a
 great majority of votes. Many new
 members were received same night.

29th Jan 1844
1st Council

My day was held the first council of the officers of the Society in which all were present except Mary Howard -
Appointments to pay the expenses of the temple of the charitable purposes were made.
The duties of the officers were explained.
During the Council it was resolved, that a committee into the Society will hereafter be made by a majority of votes of the Council, that any person who wishes to become a member will give him or her name to one of the officers to be proposed at the next meeting.

Jth Session

The 9th meeting of the Society was held on 4th Feb. 1844 - after singing an instruction on the Gospel of the day was given - Some remarks made, about paying the monthly contribution - The collection was - in consequence of not having been enough - about the resolution applied in the Council of receiving members hereafter by the majority of votes in the Council. - The things by hymns then took place in which I made a great improvement - The President made remarks to his house on Wednesday next for the purpose of improving in singing. - Several new members were received - the next meeting - the first was also read -

10th Session

The 10th meeting of the Society at No. 21, was held on 6th Feb. 1844 - began by

 held in G. Ho. on 11th Feb. 1844 - at 8 o'clock
